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# Barrio de San Pedro



## The grandeur of the everyday: O Barrio de San Pedro

Situated at the point where the French Way of St James leads into the city of Santiago de Compostela, the district of San Pedro is almost as old as the city itself, its historical character shaped by its location on the outskirts.

Pilgrims, travellers, merchants, soldiers, craftsmen and peasants have all walked these streets, imbuing them with a personality and charm that contrast with the sober magnificence of the city's historic centre. The area's grandeur is born of simplicity, the result of the commonplace and the stately, the old and the new, existing side by side for many years.

### 01 Porta do Camiño

The district of San Pedro began life as a suburb on the other side of the city's walls. It was through this gateway that pilgrims following the French Way of St James, the busiest of the pilgrimage routes, would enter the city, though it was also the point of entrance for peasants and locals making their way to the market. In days gone a number of insalubrious industries sprouted up in the area, among them leatherworks, ironworks and slaughterhouses.

### 02 Rúa de San Pedro

The final section on the Way of St James leading up to the city, this street has long been the district's main thoroughfare. Its winding route is a reflection of its past and adds to the charm of an area in which humble artisans' dwellings stood side by side with grand houses built by traders and noblemen. The Rúa de San Pedro has retained that everyday atmosphere and the hustle and bustle of the distant days when it was the main route into and out of the city.

### 03 Praza de San Pedro

The district owes its name to the ancient monastery of San Pedro de Fôra, whose medieval church and buildings once lined the square. The place of worship fell into disrepair and it was not until the 19th-century that the larger church that now stands on the site was built, making use of what little remained of its predecessor.

### 04 Pazo de Belví e Capela de San Antonio

Complete with a kitchen garden, this large house is one of many to have been built outside the city walls. Erected in the 17th century, Belví country house, as it is known, is an austere building topped by the coat of arms of the Durán Figueroa, one of the noble families that once lived in it. It is flanked by the 18th-century chapel of San Antonio; up until the last century an oakwood, the site of a famous pilgrimage, stood nearby.

### 05 Santa María de Belví

Founded in the 14th century, this convent traditionally welcomed girls from Santiago's middle class, and its humble origins are reflected by its somewhat austere architecture. It was redesigned in the 17th and 18th centuries, although part of the original building, identifiable by its wooden roof, can still be found in the church.

The magnificent main chapel is home to an image of the Virxe do Portal, whose appearance in the building's foundations was regarded as a miracle. A popular shrine, both the Virgin and the miraculous spring outside the convent were once the focal point of a major pilgrimage that took place in early September.

### 06 Seminario Menor

Though it looks a good deal older, this seminary was actually constructed in the middle of the 20th century and provides an example of the Galician *regionalista* style, which drew on typical materials and forms in modernising traditional regional architecture.

### 07 Centro Sociocultural da Trisca

Designed by John Hejduk, this small but magnificent example of contemporary architecture was completed in 2001. The facade and interior resemble a ship's bow, and the building's highlights include the bas-relief "The Spanish Wedding" on the ground floor, which exudes movement and joyfulness, and the panoramic terrace, affording outstanding views of the surrounding area.

### 08 Rúa dos Lagartos

This street and the ones adjacent to it all branch off from the Rúa de San Pedro and take the course of the paths that led to the River Sar and allotments etc, which explains their labyrinthine layout. Though the old houses that lined this street have been replaced by new ones, the thoroughfare still follows its original route.

### 09 Campo da Angustia

The Campo de la Angustia, which comprises the chapel, fountain, vestibule and transept, is an area with a charm all of its own. The chapel replaced a medieval construction built in order to consecrate the land on which were buried prisoners who had been sentenced to death and other unfortunates denied funerals on holy ground.

The chapel is home to the confraternity of Nosa Sra. da Quinta Angustia, the oldest of the brotherhoods holding Easter processions in the streets of Santiago, and with strong roots in the district.

### 10 Rúas da Angustia, Rosario, Bonaval

Lined by traditional houses, this series of streets provided an alternative route for pilgrims and travellers arriving in the city. The 14th-century Pórtico da Virxe de Bonaval, the gateway offering access to the monastery of the same name, stands on a corner at one end of the street. It is adorned with an image of the Virgin bearing the inscription: *Esta imaxee he aquí posta alma de Iohan Tuorum era MCCCCLCVIII*, a reference to the Holy Man of Bonaval, whose honour was miraculously saved by the Virgin in this very place.

### 11 San Domingos de Bonaval

According to tradition, this monastery was founded by St. Domingo in the 13th century. A significant part of the church's Gothic structure survives to this day, as do the tombs of Santiago noblemen and women. The church also comprises the 17th-century chapels of San Jacinto, El Rosario and San Vicente Ferrer as well as the chapel of Santo Domingo en Suriano (*now the Panteón de Galegos Ilustres*).

The rooms once used by the monks are now home to the Museo do Pobo Galego, which boasts the finest collection devoted to traditional Galician culture and a striking triple spiral staircase designed by Domingo Antonio de Andrade (c. 17th-18th).

### 12 Centro Galego de Arte Contemporánea

Designed by the Portuguese architect Álvaro Siza, the CGAC is no ordinary museum. Showcasing the latest architectural developments in the old town, it is a flagship centre revealing new trends in Galician and international art.
